

ESSENTIAL CAT VACCINATION



CoreVaccines

Rabies. A devastating disease that infects the brain and is almost always fatal. Rabies is caused by the rabies virus. It is contagious to humans and can cause pets to suddenly become violent without warning.

Non-CoreVaccines

Feline chlamydiosis. An infection caused by the bacterium chlamydophila felis that can affect a cat's eyes and respiratory system.



CoreVaccines

Feline panleukopenia. A viral disease caused by the feline parvovirus. It is often fatal for kittens and immuno-compromised cats, especially if they are not hospitalized.



Non-CoreVaccines

Feline leukemia virus. A common and incurable infectious disease that impairs the immune system. The decision on whether to receive the vaccine is highly dependent on lifestyle. Please speak to your veterinarian for more information about risk factors and the feline leukemia vaccine.



Non-CoreVaccines

Feline herpesvirus-1. This highly infectious disease is a common cause of upper respiratory and eye infections.

Why?

Vaccinating your pet is one of the easiest way to protect them against serious illnesses.

When?

Kittens start their vaccines at 8-9 weeks, and have a second booster at 12 weeks plus the rabies vaccine. A single booster vaccination is then given annually.

Registration?

In Dubai, a municipality tag is being issued when rabies is given. Registration is done yearly and is mandatory.
