- Bright red gums**

- Disoriented**
- Confused**
- Lethargic**
- Anxious**

BODY

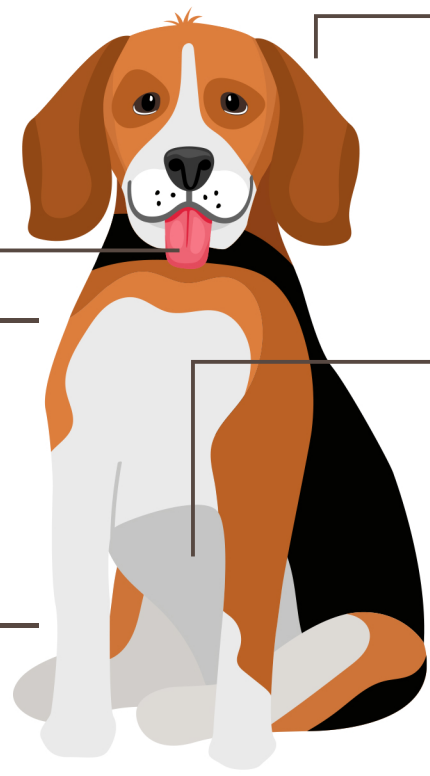
- Weakness**

STOMACH

- Vomiting**
- Diarrhea**
- Dark Urine**
- Loss of Appetite**

LEGS

- Wobbly**
- Unsteady**

6 STEPS TO PREVENT A HEAT STROKE IN YOUR PET

- 1. Limit their time outdoors**
- 2. Never leave them in a hot car**
- 3. Give them water and shade**
- 4. Restrict exercise**
- 5. Stay off of asphalt**
- 6. Dont get them shaved**
